Thought For The Week: As we enter the third week of Lent, we become more and more aware of the need in our own lives for pruning. This Sunday we are invited to consider the ways in which our lifestyles might be negatively impacting on others. In a particular way, we are called to look at how our lifestyles in the developed world might be negatively impacting on the lives of our brothers and sisters in the developing world: on people like Domitille and her family.

Domitille has inherited her mother's elegance. At six, she's already learning how to balance a large jerry can full of water on her head as she walks from the well to her house. She goes with her older sister, Violante, to fetch water for the family each day. It takes her a little longer to get home as she's concentrating on her balance.

Domitille is a friendly, outgoing little girl who's quick to smile. Her beautiful face graces the front of more than one million Trocaire boxes distributed throughout Ireland this Lent. It's a poignant reminder that there is an actual person behind the stark statistic that cloaks the scandal of world hunger. Domitille is one of over a billion people in the world who are hungry. She knows hunger. She just doesn't know that she's a number in a world full of hungry people.
